## Past tense verbs with an -ed ending are pronounced in three different ways:

- 1- [t] after voiceless sounds : [p,k,f,s...]
- 2- [d] after voiced sounds: [b,g,v,z...]
- 3- [Id] after the sounds [t] or [d]




