SOME GUIDELINES

- ✓ No reading ! You are only allowed to look at the table with your notes and key words.

WHAT	Present the topic (is it related to politics ? the environment ? sport ? education ? the world of work ?...)
WHEN & WHERE	When and where did the event take place ?
WHO	Who is concerned ? One person in particular ? A group of people ? A whole nation ?...
WHY	Why is this topic important ? Will it have an impact on the future ? Why does it matter to you and why did you decide to talk about it ?
EXTRA	Do you need to (briefly) explain some past events or make some connections with other people / places / points of view in order to clarify the things you said ?

- ✓ Don't write everything in French and then translate. Take notes in English directly !
- ✓ Don't try to memorise a text by heart and then recite it like a robot. It won't sound natural and this is not what is expected.
- ✓ Your English doesn't have to be perfect, of course ! But make sure you avoid the common mistakes on verbal forms, pronouns, etc.
- ✓ Communication skills and body language : don't speak too fast, speak loud enough, look at your audience, make some pauses, stress the important pieces of information, and show you're interested in what you're saying !
